It is a Board of School education in India that conducts the Indian Certificate of Secondary Education and the Indian School Certificate examinations for Class X and Class XII respectively.

- \bullet Officials have pointed out that these examinations would be "application-based and would not require preparation". $\$
- They said that the results of the Class V and Class VIII board exams will not have any bearing on the students promotion to the next class.
- The council's main objective is to assess the standard of teaching and thus keep schools on track.
- They also believe that the tests would enable children to take the board examinations in their stride in future.
- They also announced that the board has decided to introduce three compulsory subjects -- Sanskrit, yoga and performing arts.
- Yoga and performing arts will be compulsory between classes Class I and

VIII, while Sanskrit will be taught from Classes V to VIII. \n
