- The Pharma industry experts believe the government is considering norms to make prescription of generic drugs mandatory. \nlambda{n}
- Typically, doctors prescribe branded products to their patients and there is a view within the government that the cost of healthcare could be reduced by promoting generic medicines.
- The industry, however, is not enthused with the idea and feels this will be difficult to implement.

• Earlier the government in its **drug policy in 1978** had proposed abolition of

brand names in respect of five drugs including analgin and aspirin but the same was successfully challenged by manufacturers in the court. \n

• The Pharma experts expect some pro-pharma industry measures in terms of incentives to research, active pharmaceutical ingredients and some tax relief.

• The life sciences sector had great expectations from the budget not only from a fiscal incentives perspective but also from a regulatory angle; more so, given the **government's vision of making India one of the top-three pharmaceutical markets by 2020.**
