

Dam Safety Bill 2018 - TN Opposition

Why in news?

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A recent Tamil Nadu Assembly resolution demands that the Centre keeps the Dam Safety Bill 2018 in abeyance.

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What is the Bill on?

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- The objective is to help all states and Union Territories adopt uniform dam safety procedures. γ_n

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- The Bill is to address all issues concerning dam safety including \n

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- i. regular inspection of dams
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ii. emergency action plan

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- iii. comprehensive dam safety review
- ${\rm iv.}\,$ adequate repair and maintenance funds for dam safety $_{\n}$
- v. Instrumentation and Safety Manuals

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- It proposes a National Committee and State Committees on Dam Safety. \slashn
- $\ensuremath{\cdot}$ The National Committee will formulate policies and regulations on Dam

Safety.

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What is the NDSA?

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• The National Dam Safety Authority (NDSA) will mediate with the state organisations and dam owners.

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- It works for standardisation of dam safety-related data and practices. $\slash n$
- Besides, it \n

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- i. gives dam safety assistance n
- ii. maintains a national-level database of dams with records of failures \n
- iii. looks after design or construction of new dams $\normalin{\charge}{\normalin{\charge}{\charge}}$
- ${\rm iv.}$ eliminates inter-state disputes $\normalizes\normalinterentes\normalizes\normalizes\normalizes\normalizes\norm$

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What is the need?

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- Most dams in India are constructed and maintained by the states. $\ensuremath{\sc n}$
- Some of the bigger ones are managed by autonomous bodies. $\ensuremath{\sc n}$
- E.g. Damodar Valley Corporation or Bhakra Beas Management Board $\^{n}$
- There is lack of legal and institutional architecture for dam safety in India. $\^{\n}$
- This has kept the dam safety an issue of concern for long. \slashn
- Unsafe dams are a hazard and dam break may cause disasters. h
- The Centre has come up with the Bill when about 450 dams are being

constructed.

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Why is Tamil Nadu opposing?

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- The TN resolution proposed that the Bill had contentious clauses. $\ensuremath{\sc vn}$
- The Bill allows the NDSA to inspect dams situated across intra-state rivers. $\ensuremath{\sc n}$
- This is being viewed as an attempt to encroach on the state's powers and rights.

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- This is especially with respect to Dams constructed by the State Government in the neighbouring State. \n
- It is said to cause various problems in their maintenance and operation. $\ensuremath{\sc n}$
- It wants the Centre to arrive at a consensus with the states. h
- Till then, it asks the Centre to keep in abeyance the process of legislating on the Bill.

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What is the Mullaperiyar issue?

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• Tamil Nadu owns dams in Mullaperiyar, Parambikulam, Thunakadavu and Peruvaripallam in Kerala.

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- The two states have engaged in dispute over the Mullaperiyar dam. $\ensuremath{\sc n}$
- Tamil Nadu government wants to raise the water level to 142 feet and carry out repair.

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- But Kerala has opposed it citing safety threats. $\space{\space{1.5}n}$

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- Kerala Irrigation and Water Conservation (Amendment) Act 2006 limits the full reservoir level to 136 feet. \n
- The Supreme Court had struck down the Act, and the order went against Kerala.

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- Eventually, an SC team inspected the dam and confirmed that the dam was safe.
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- Given this, the latest move by the Centre has made Tamil Nadu cautious about its authority and assets. \n
- More objections are likely to follow from other states as well. $\ensuremath{\sc vn}$
