

Economic sanctions on North Korea

Why in news?

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Recently following new UN sanctions, China announced that it will halt iron, iron ore and seafood imports from North Korea.

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What is the reason for economic sanctions on North Korea?

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- It successfully tested the Hwasong 14 ICBM. $\space{\space{1.5}n}$
- After the second test, it appears that the missile could travel up to 10,000 km.
- It is enough to hit the US mainland, and possibly even cities like Chicago, New York, or Washington, DC.
- In the regime for developing such ballistic missiles.

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What does this economic sanctions include?

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- **Exports** The tough new sanctions would prohibit export of North Korean coal, iron, iron ore, lead, lead ore, and seafood. \n
- These industries account for about a third of all of North Korean exports. \slashn
- Investments It sets new limits on North Korea's Foreign Trade Bank by banning new joint ventures between North Korea and foreign companies. \n
- It prohibits new foreign investments in North Korean ventures, and caps

the number of workers the country can send abroad.

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What is the trade relationship of China with N.Korea?

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- China accounts for 90% of North Korea's trade. $\space{1mm}\spa$
- China imported \$74.4 million worth of iron ore in the first five months of this year, almost equalling the figure for all of 2016. \nlambda
- Fish and seafood imports totalled \$46.7 million in June 2017. $\ngreen n$
- Beijing had already announced a suspension of coal imports in February. $\slash n$

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What is the significance of China's move?

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• USA has been pressuring Beijing to take a harder stance against North Korea.

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- China voted for the measure in UN, after repeated accusation from US that China is not doing enough to harness in its neighbour. \n
- Given that China is North Korea's largest trading partner, this move is expected to be effective. \n

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What are the issues with this sanction?

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- It's unclear whether it will curtail the nation's weapons program. $\space{\space{1.5}\space{1.5$
- Past sanctions have not discouraged the regime in its quest to develop nuclear weapons.

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- The sanctions would punish North Korean leaders in particular. $\slash n$
- It's unclear how the sanctions will impact ordinary citizens. \slashn
- It is doubtful whether china will keep its commitments for maintaining the sanctions.
