Government Amends Definition of Start-Ups

- Startup India was launched by the Government of India on 16th January, 2016 to build a strong eco-system for nurturing innovation and Startups in the country to drive economic growth and generate large scale employment opportunities.

- In order to promote entrepreneurship in the country, the Government of India has amended the definition of a Startup. The following significant changes have been made to the definition of Startups -

- **Age of Startup increased:** Taking into account the long gestation period by Startups to establish, an entity shall be considered as a Startup up to seven years from the date of its incorporation/ registration (from earlier 5 years). However, in the case of Startups in the Biotechnology sector, the period shall be up to ten years from the date of incorporation/ registration.

- **No Letter of Recommendation required:** No letter of recommendation from an incubator/industry association shall be required for either recognition or tax benefits

\n

- **Potential of Job and Wealth Creation:** The scope of definition has been broadened to include scalability of business model with potential of employment generation or wealth creation.

National Waterways

- The Union Cabinet has accorded its approval for amendment of **Central Road Fund Act, 2000** to allocate 2.5% of the proceeds of Central Road Fund (CRF) for development and maintenance of National Waterways (NWs).

- An allocation of 2.5% of CRF proceeds would provide approximately Rs.2000 crore per annum for the development and maintenance of NWs at existing rates of duties funding the CRF.

- The National Waterways Act, 2016 for developing and maintaining the existing **five NWs and new 106 NWs** has been passed by Parliament and is now enforced.

- The arrangement approved by the Cabinet; would make available adequate and sustainable source of funding for NWs through institutional means of CRF.

India's longest bridge

- The Prime Minister, today inaugurated India's longest bridge - **the 9.15 km long Dhol-Sadiya bridge, over the River Brahmaputra**, in Assam.

- The bridge will enhance connectivity and greatly reduce travel time between Assam and Arunachal Pradesh.

- The Prime Minister said enhanced connectivity between the North-East and other parts of the country is a priority for the Union Government, and work has been greatly speeded up in this regard.

- He said that good connectivity in the North-East will also link the region with the economy of South-East Asia.

India's first underwater rail tunnel

- Afcons Trans Tunnelstroy and Kolkata Metro Railway Corporation Ltd implementing the East West Metro have completed boring the country's first tunnel **under the Hooghly river** for establishing metro link between Howrah and Kolkata.

- **Rachna**, a giant tunnel-boring machine (TBM), was deployed to dig the

underwater tunnel that runs a length of 502 metres under the river.

- Afcons Transtonnelstroy is an Indo-Russian joint venture.

- The project connects Howrah to the west and Salt lake to the east.
