- The 11th Ministerial Conference (MC11) will take place from 10 to 13 December 2017 in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

- The Ministerial Conference, will be attended by trade ministers and other senior officials from the organization's 164 members.

\n

- It is the highest decision-making body of the WTO.

- Under the Marrakesh Agreement Establishing the WTO, the Ministerial Conference is to meet at least once every two years.

- The last Ministerial Conference took place in Nairobi, Kenya, in December 2015.

- It ordered comprehensive plan on Taj Trapezium Zone (TTZ) an area of about 10,400 sq kms spread over spread over 6 districts of UP and Bharatpur in Rajasthan for a few hundred years should be prepared.
