About the Ministry

• The Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment has its origin from the erstwhile Ministry of Welfare.

The 2 departments under the Ministry are:

- 1. Department of Social Justice and Empowerment (Samajik Nyaya and Adhikarita Vibhag)
- 2. Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan)
 - The Ministry is entrusted with the welfare, social justice and empowerment of disadvantaged and marginalized sections.
 - The marginalized sections includes scheduled and backward classes, persons with disabilities, senior citizens, victims of drug abuse, transgender and so on.
 - Union minister Dr. Virendra Kumar.
 - Secretary of Department of Social Justice Empowerment Shri Amit Yadav (IAS).
 - Secretary of Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities Rajesh Aggarwal (IAS).

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Pre-Matric and Post-Matric Scholarship

- The Pre & Post-Matric Scholarship Scheme Is provided for <u>SC</u>, <u>ST</u> and <u>OBC</u> <u>students</u> for educational empowerment of students of above categories.
- They are implemented through the State Governments/ UT Administrations.
- They are *Centrally Sponsored Scholarships Schemes*.

SHREYAS - Scholarships for Higher Education for Young Achievers Scheme

- SHREYAS scheme for SC, consists of *4 Sub-schemes*, which are:
 - 1. Free coaching scheme for SCs and OBCs
 - 2. Top Class Education for SCs
 - 3. National overseas Scholarship Scheme for SCs etc
 - 4. National Fellowship for SCs

SRESHTA - Scheme for Residential Education for Students in High Schools in Targeted Areas

• Aim - To improve the educational and socioeconomic conditions of Scheduled Castes

(SCs) through the efforts of grant-in-aid institutions (run by NGOs) and residential high schools.

<u>Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955 (PCR Act)</u> prohibits the practice of untouchability and punishes those who enforce disabilities arising from it.

Pradhan Mantri Anusuchit Jaati Abhyuday Yojana (PM-AJAY)

- **Aim** To reduce poverty of the SC communities by generation of additional employment opportunities through skill development, income generating schemes and other initiatives.
- **Launched in** 2021-22.

- Self-Employment Loan Scheme Total Disbursement of Rs. 165.79 Cr to 12,240 Beneficiaries by the NSFDC.
- Cluster Development 676 SC weavers were identified in a Baseline survey by NSFDC engaged in making of Chanderi sarees at several villages.

National Commission for Scheduled -Castes (NCSC)

- e-Grievance Management Portal (e-GMP) 24x7 grievance redressal platform by NCSC, with real-time tracking of complaints, as part of the Digital India Programme.
- Review The Commission conducted reviews of Public Sector Undertakings/ Public Sector Banks to evaluate implementation of the Reservation Policy & implementation of the various schemes for SC welfare.

Venture Capital Fund for Scheduled Castes (VCF-SC)


- **Aim** To promote entrepreneurship among Scheduled Castes (SCs), by providing concessional finance to SC entrepreneurs.
- Established Union Budget 2014-15.
- **Fund Managed** By the *Industrial Finance Corporation of India* with a total corpus of RS 750 Cr.

The Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes (<u>Prevention of Atrocities</u>)

<u>Act, 1989 (POA Act)</u> aims to prevent crimes against members of the Scheduled Castes (SCs) and Scheduled Tribes (STS).

Ambedkar Social Innovation and Incubation Mission (ASIIM)

- **Aim** To promote innovation among SC students, researchers, and those working with technology business incubators and Atal Incubation Centres.
- Fund assistance up to Rs 30 lakh is provided to youth beneficiaries.
- Launched on 30.09.2020.
- The scheme aligns with the 'Stand Up India' initiative of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.
- It was launched under the VCF-SC.



PM Young Achievers Scholarship Award Scheme for Vibrant India (PM YASASVI)

- **PM YASASVI** Is a flagship initiative by the Government of India, aimed at *providing* scholarships to students.
- Vision Sabka Sath, Sabka Vikas, means together with all, development for all.

National Backward Classes Finance and Development Corporation (NBCFDC)

2 categories – The Corporation has rationalized its schemes into 2 categories such as <u>Individual Loan</u> and <u>Group Loan</u>, from the current financial year (2024) to facilitate clearer communication.

Marketing Linkages – The commission <u>supports</u> <u>the artisans</u> by providing opportunities to participate in the <u>country's leading fairs</u> such as the Shilp Samagam Mela, Dilli Haat, India International Trade Fair and so on.

Traditional Artisans Upliftment Livelihood Promotion Programme (TULIP)

- Launched on 05 November 2024.
- **About** TULIP is a Digital Platform for Craft and Community Empowerment.
- It will provide a platform for economic self-reliance and global exposure to artisans via an e-marketplace.
- The launch of TULIP products in the domestic market places will be completed by January 2025.

Pradhan Mantri Dakshta Aur Kushalta Sampann Hitgrahi (PM-DAKSH)

- **Aim** To enhance competency level of the target groups to make them employable both in self- employment and wage-employment for their socio-economic development.
- **Objective** To increase family income of marginalised people by <u>increasing skill levels</u> <u>of the target youth</u> by providing short term skill training followed by engagement in wage/self- employment.
- It is a *Central Sector Scheme* that was launched during 2020-21.

<u>NBCFDC</u> has recently registered with the National Stock Exchange – Social Stock Exchange (NSE-SSE) as well as on Bombay Stock Exchange – Social Stock Exchange (BSE-SSE) to enhance community transformation through expanded donation sources.
