# **Ecomark scheme and Green Credit Programme** *vering*

Ahead of the COP 28, set to held in Dubai in November-December 2023, the Union government has notified two initiatives namely Eco Mark Scheme and Green Credit Programme.

- The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change has introduced 2 pioneering initiatives to promote country's pro-active approach to climate change.
- These initiatives seek to encourage environmentally friendly practices rooted in tradition and conservation; reflecting the ideas of LiFE concept.
- The 2 initiatives include:
  - 1. Green Credit Program (GCP)
  - 2. Ecomark scheme

### **Green Credit Program (GCP)**

- It is an *innovative market-based mechanism* designed to incentivize voluntary environmental actions.
- The environmental actions include across diverse sectors such as various stakeholders like individuals, communities, private sector industries and companies.
- GCP will focus on water conservation and afforestation.
- The Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE) serves as the GCP Administrator, responsible for program implementation, management, monitoring, and operation.
- Green Credit Registry and trading platform is being developed by ICFRE to facilitate the registration and the buying and selling of green credits.

• The GCP's governance framework is supported by an inter-ministerial Steering Committee.

### **Ecomark Scheme**

- Ecomark Scheme promotes Eco-Friendly Products.
- It provides accreditation and labelling for household and consumer products that meet specific environmental criteria while maintaining quality standards as per Indian norms.
- The Central Pollution Control Board administers the Eco mark Scheme in partnership with Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS).
- Products accredited under the Ecomark Scheme will adhere to specific environmental criteria, ensuring minimal environmental impact.
- It will build consumer awareness of environmental issues and encourage eco-conscious choices.
- It will also motivate manufacturers to shift towards environmentally friendly production.

## Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act, 1971

The Supreme Court have questioned of foetal viability and rights of unborn child in its recent hearing of a married woman's request to end her 26-week pregnancy.

- An unwanted pregnancy due to failure of contraceptive methods is the same as a forced pregnancy for which termination is allowed up to 24 weeks.
- The Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act (MTP Act), 1971 allows termination of pregnancy in 3 stages.
  - Termination of pregnancy up to 20 weeks is allowed on the advice of one doctor.
  - If a pregnancy is 20-24 weeks, the right to seek abortion is determined by two registered medical practitioners as an exception, but only under certain categories.
  - After 24 weeks of pregnancy, a medical board must be set up in "approved facilities", which may "allow or deny termination of pregnancy" only if there is substantial foetal abnormality.
- Section 3B of the Rules under the MTP Act lists 7 categories of forced pregnancies that includes
  - Statutory rape in case of minors or sexual assault and
  - Women with disabilities or when there is a change in marital status of women during pregnancy.
- But in several cases the Supreme Court has allowed termination beyond 26 weeks for rape survivors.
- Foetal viability is the ability of a human foetus to survive outside the uterus.
- Foetal viability in 1973 was pegged at 28 weeks (7 months), which is now with scientific advancement lower at 23-24 weeks.

- The criticism of India's law is that the decision to terminate after 20 weeks is shifted to doctors and not the woman.

#### NexCAR19

Recently 'NexCAR19' received approval from Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation's (CDSO) for the treatment of cancer.

- NexCAR19 is an indigenously developed CD19-targeted CAR-T cell therapy.
- CD-19 is biomarker for B lymphocytes and can be utilised as a target for leukemia immunotherapies.
- It was developed by the Immunoadoptive Cell Therapy Private Limited (ImmunoACT), an IIT Bombay-incubated company.
- CAR-T Cell Therapy A type of cancer immunotherapy treatment that uses immune cells called T cells that are genetically altered in a laboratory to enable them to locate and destroy cancer cells more effectively.
- CAR T-cell therapy is generally accompanied by some side effects that include cytokine release syndrome (CRS).
- It is when CAR T-cells multiply, they can release large amounts of chemicals called cytokines into the blood, which can ramp up the immune system.
- NexCAR19 has shown an excellent balance of efficacy and low toxicity, which is a significant advantage in clinical management (post-infusion) of the patients in our resource-constrained settings.

#### **Kawar Lake**

Bird hunting and land acquisition threaten Kawar Lake and it is on the verge of drying up.

- It is also known as Gokhur Lake.
- It is a natural freshwater wetland.
- It is the only <u>Ramsar site</u> that is located in *Bihar*.
- To be designated as a Ramsar site, wetlands must meet certain criteria, the most important of which is that they should be rare and natural.
- The second most important is that they should support the life cycle of endangered species in

adverse conditions.

- This lake draws water from the confluence of the Gandak, the Bia and the Kareh river.
- It is an oxbow lake.
- Oxbow lakes are crescent-like water bodies formed due to erosion and deposition in meanders of rivers.
- The lake has been drying up since 2010.

### **African Swine Fever (ASF)**

Recently the Manipur's Imphal witnessed the outbreak of the African swine fever.

- African swine fever is a highly contagious and deadly viral disease affecting both domestic and feral swine of all ages.
- ASF is not a threat to human health and cannot be transmitted from pigs to humans.
- It is found in countries around the world.
- ASF is a different disease to swine flu.
- The clinical signs of ASF may occur in chronic, sub-acute or acute form.
- The incubation period for ASF is variable but is usually between 5 and 15 days.
- The symptoms of ASF includes:
  - Vomiting,
  - Diarrhoea (sometimes bloody),
  - Reddening or darkening of the skin, particularly ears and snout,
  - Gummed up eyes,
  - Laboured breathing and coughing,
  - Abortion, still births and weak litters and
  - Weakness and unwillingness to stand.
- Traditionally this serious disease has occurred mainly in Africa with the only endemic area in the European Union (EU) being the Italian island of Sardinia.
- However, since 2017 the disease has also been reported in Central and Eastern Europe.
- African Swine Fever can be spread through the following ways:
  - Direct contact with infected pigs, faeces or body fluids,
  - $\circ\,$  Indirect contact via fomites such as equipment, vehicles or people who work with pigs between pig farms with ineffective biosecurity and
  - Pigs eating infected pig meat or meat products.
