AI Readiness Assessment Methodology (RAM) in India

A two-day stakeholder consultation on AI Readiness Assessment Methodology (RAM) in India was recently conducted by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) and UNESCO.

- The RAM is a key tool to support Member States in their implementation of the UNESCO Recommendation on the Ethics of AI.
- RAM includes a range of quantitative and qualitative questions designed to gather information about different dimensions related to a country's AI ecosystem:
 - Including the legal and regulatory, social and cultural, economic, scientific and educational, and technological and infrastructural dimensions.
- The implementation of the RAM is adapted to the unique circumstances and characteristics of the country, as well as the budget available for the project.
- RAM in India is an initiative of UNESCO and the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) with *Ikigai Law* as the implementing partner.

- Kalaripayattu is the oldest and most scientific of all martial arts in the world.

Praja Mandal Movement

- The Praja Mandal movement was a part of the Indian independence movement that took place in the 1920s.
- It was a *popular movement in the princely states of India* that fought against the British administration and feudal rulers for basic rights and freedoms.
- **Objectives** - To protect the civil liberties of the masses.
 - To protest against oppressive taxes.
 - To seek reforms in the peasants' conditions.
 - To open educational institutions.
 - To have a responsible government.
- **Coverage** - It spread over 600 princely states of British India.
- **Important leaders** - Kharak Singh and Master Tara Singh.
- **Significance** - Now part of the Malwa region, with some parts in Haryana, these areas are politically active even today and were hotbeds of the recent farmers' agitations.
- **Punjab Riyasat Praja Mandal** - Was presided the Sewa Singh Thikriwala.
- It was largely run by Akali leaders.

Bluetongue (BT)

- Bluetongue (BT) is a non-contagious, viral disease affecting domestic and wild ruminants (primarily sheep and including cattle, goats, buffalo, antelope, deer, elk and camels).
- **Symptoms** - Blue discolouration of the tongue, fever, facial swelling and excessive salivation.
- **Transmission** - By insects, particularly biting midges of the ***Culicoides species***.
- Vectors are infected with BT virus after ingesting blood from infected animals.
- *Without the vector, the disease cannot spread from animal to animal.*
- BT virus transmission can occur *throughout the year*, particularly during rainy periods.
- Cattle often have a higher infection rate than sheep.
- **The BT virus is not transmitted through contact with animals, wool or consumption of milk. (Statement 2 is incorrect)**
- **Public health risk** - There is **no public health risk associated with BT**.
- **Geographical distribution** - It is present in Africa, Asia, Australia, Europe, North America and several islands in the tropics and subtropics.
- **Prevention - Vaccination is used as the most effective** and practical measure to minimize losses related to the disease.
- It can potentially interrupt the cycle from infected animal to vector along with insect control measures.
