Blue Carbon

- Blue Carbon: It pertains to the carbon sinks found in <u>coastal, aquatic, and marine</u> <u>environments</u>, which are sustained by vegetation, marine life, and sediments.
- Coastal ecosystems such *as mangroves, tidal marshes, and seagrass meadows serve* as substantial reservoirs of carbon, accumulated through vegetation and various natural processes over long periods.
- These ecosystems are <u>capable of sequestering and storing carbon—commonly known as</u> <u>'blue carbon'</u>—at a rate that often surpasses that of terrestrial forests when measured per unit area.
