- The <u>medals and certificates</u> for the athletes will be made from <u>environmentally friendly</u> and <u>biodegradable materials</u>. (Statement 3 is correct)

Ethanol Blended Petrol (EBP) Programme:

• Ethanol Blended Petrol (EBP) programme was launched in January, 2003. The programme sought

to promote the use of alternative and environment friendly fuels and to reduce import dependency for energy requirements.

- The Programme is implemented by **the Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas**. (**Statement 1 is not correct**).
- The programme aims to achieve the target of 20% blending of Ethanol with petrol by 2025 previously the target year was 2030. (**Statement 2 is correct**)
- This programme has been extended to whole of India <u>except Union Territories of Andaman Nicobar and Lakshadweep islands</u>. (Statement 3 is not correct)

Indian Squid

- Indian Squid, also known as the Indian calamari, belongs to the molluscan class Cephalopoda, which includes species like squids, octopuses, and cuttlefish. (**Statement 1 is correct**).
- <u>They are fast swimmers</u> and are capable of propelling themselves through the water using a jet propulsion system that allows them <u>to reach speeds of up to 40 km/h</u> when escaping from predators or chasing prey. (Statement 2 is not correct).
- Squids tend to **prefer areas with high levels of dissolved oxygen**, as this is crucial for their respiration.
- It is distributed <u>in the Indo-Pacific region</u>, occurring in <u>depths between 30 and 170 meters</u>. (Statement 3 is correct).
- The IUCN has classified the Indian Squid as Least concern. (Statement 4 is not correct).

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- 5) With reference to Namdapha National Park, consider the following statements:
 - 1. It is the easternmost tiger reserve of India, located in Arunachal Pradesh.

Namdapha National Park

- Namdapha National Park is India's easternmost tiger reserve and National park situated in the Changlang district of Arunachal Pradesh. (*Statement 1 is correct*)
- The Namdapha protected area is wedged between Dapha Bum ridge of Mishmi Hills, of North Eastern Himalayas and Patkai Ranges.
- The reserve has a common boundary with Kamlang Wildlife Sanctuary (Lohit District). (**Statement 2 is not correct).**
- It is the only National Park in the world to have all four big cat species—Tiger, Leopard, Snow Leopard, and Clouded Leopard. *(Statement 3 is correct)*

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
