- World Heritage Convention It is formally known as the "Convention Concerning the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage," was adopted by UNESCO in 1972.
- Aim of the convention To identify, protect, and preserve cultural and natural heritage sites of outstanding universal value.
- This agreement explains what countries need to do to find and take care of special sites that can be added to the World Heritage List.
- Signatories of the convention As of October 2024, 196 countries have joined the World Heritage Convention and India became part of this Convention in November 1977.

Red Sea

- **Red Sea** It is a semi-enclosed tropical sea, an extension of the Indian Ocean and spans approximately 1,930 km from the Suez Canal to the Bab el-Mandeb Strait.
- Border by 6 countries, including Saudi Arabia, Yemen, Egypt, Sudan, Eritrea and Djibouti.
- Syria is not a bordering country of Rea Sea.
- **Geographical connections** It connects the Mediterranean Sea through the Suez Canal and the Arabian Sea via the Gulf of Aden.
- **Geological formation** It was formed by the separation of the African and Arabian tectonic plates, a process that continues today, widening the sea by about 15 mm annually.
- Marine Ecosystem It harbours climate change-resistant coral reefs, crucial for global marine biodiversity and provides habitat for endangered species like hawksbill turtles and dugongs.
- Environmental threats Over-tourism, coastal development, oil spills, and the increasing risk of coral bleaching due to rising sea temperatures.
