- To resolve online hateful and harmful, illegal content a modern intermediary laws should be created, as European Union has Digital Services Act (DSA). It also provides opportunity for intermediaries to challenge government's decision to block content.

- platforms will retain reasonable autonomy over their terms of service by providing flexibility in defining the evolving standards of harmful content.
- online platforms themselves seek to promote platform speech and security so that the users have safe and free experience.
- Instituting co-regulatory mechanisms allows the state outsource content regulation platforms, which will tackle the ever modernizing problems.

while processing <sup>and</sup> addressing the grievances by platforms they must provide notices and increase the algorithm transparency to enhance their platform accountability.

Thus, Digit India Act is expected to be the successor law to IT act enhancing the privacy of both the people and the states.
