### India - Australia relations

India and Australia have relations dating back to 1960s.

① Trade India is 8<sup>th</sup> largest trading partner for Australia and the trade stands at \$27 billion. Measures such as ECTA (Economic co-operation Agreement for Economic cooperation) and preferential market access for Indian goods was signed.

The 5<sup>th</sup> round talks can strengthen the ECTA framework and Australia's India's

for growth.

② Security Both countries are part of Quad, India's oceans own association. Both countries signed 2+2 agreement for further expanding defense ties.

Australia's membership in AUKUS and Quad, US will give fillip to Indian Ocean security with India.

③ Energy India imports clean coal technology and Australia joined India led International Solar Alliance.

Challenges China has signed security pact with Solomon Islands to deter anti-China movement. India's tariff policy is also unclear with respect to further trade is good.

India's membership in APEC - Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation can be spelled out in trade T-S meeting which can further strengthen ties between two countries.
