India needs a comprehensive strategy to fight production, spread and sharing of online inappropriate content. Discus

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) conducted Operation Megh Chabzi which was followed by Operation Carbars to combat the CSAM - Child sex abusive materials. A discussion in the digital ecosystem can solve the issue.

Inappropriate contents online

The ISP- hosted service providers are exempted from the liability of any third party violation. This loophole is exploited to circulate offensive content.

The misinformation results in hate speech, witch hunting and mob lynching. The worse being child pornography. The Information technology act do not have provisions for mandatory reporters of child abuse though there are punitive measures.

Efforts taken

Global efforts such as Cyber HP by Ncmec National centre of missing and exploited children may notify the internet service provider to block CSAM content.

The National crime records bureau signed MoU with NCMEC to report child abuse.

The UK based IWF internet watch foundation dissects the child abuse availability. Similarly Shreya Singh case directed the ISPs to remove illegal content upon direction from court government or courts.

Way forward

The Jairam Ramesh committee has recommended to break the end-end encryption and use judicial support to investigate dark web, financial support to access the CSAM. The recommendations and INHOPE hotline participation can prevent spread of inappropriate content.
