


Q) Near-universal social security pensions would be significant in expanding the public support for the elderly in the country. Discuss (250 words)

Ans: The share of the elderly (persons aged 60 years and above) in India's population, close to 9% in 2011, is growing fast and may reach 18% by 2036 according to National Commission on Population.

Given the conservative estimates of the elderly people, they are going through various medical conditions

- 30% to 50% of total elderly have symptoms of depression.



- Health conditions, loneliness and poverty account for depression
- The proportion of depression symptoms is much higher in women.
- Widows and disabled elderly are more vulnerable

To tackle the exacerbating situation of elderly and provide safety net, the govt can adopt Mean-universal pension

- through National Social Assistance Programme (NSAP)
- By widening the base of benefit so that elderly across all the class could be covered
- Government can launch a targeted scheme like Vayo Vridh, in that direction.

- Government can utilise JAM trinity to provide direct transfer.
  - Other states of India should replica - le the model of Tamilnadu ~~for~~ and Rajasthan to provide safety net in the form of ~~safety~~ <sup>elderly</sup> pension.
  - Government should hope in private organisation to get correct estimates of beneficiary.

Though it may cost public exche-  
- quer but providing near universal  
security, government may realise  
the DPSR principle partially.
