Being a propeller of several other crimes, anti-trafficking legislation has to be passed by the Govt of India for the welfare of society. Explain (200w)

During covid times more than 9000 children and women were trafficked and half of them was rescued. Says data released by an NGO. Human trafficking is a crime in itself, but it is also the propeller of several other crimes.

Increased Vulnerability:

①. Due to low income some parents sell their child to someone and earn money through it.

②. The increase in internet access has led to cyber-trafficking.

③. These trafficked children are brutally raped, used as a domestic worker, sometimes they are beaten heavily.

Anti-trafficking bill:

①. The Government of India proposed the Trafficking in Persons (Prevention, Care and Rehabilitation) Bill, 2021.

②. This bill aims to tackle all aspects of trafficking and gives punishments including death penalty for certain crimes.

③ It also provides AHTU's (Anti-human trafficking units) at Centre, state and district levels.

Human trafficking is a crime which
paradoxically creates black economy. No nation can call
itself civilised if it tolerates trafficking of children.
It fuels child marriages, prostitution, child labour,
corruption, terrorism, etc. There can be no greater
gift to India than the freedom of our children.
