

24 Enumerate the pre-independence feminist movements that played a crucial role in guaranteeing women's rights in Indian Constitution

Women participation in the national movement has been significant owing to its transition from violent to non-violent means. Such movements garnered their rights in our constitution.

Pre-independence movements and rights

1. Age consent = The Sarda Act of 1929

led to increase in the marriage age for girls to 16. This has inspired the Child Marriage Amendment Bill 2021 to increase the age to 21 years.

This can ensure their time in education and employment.

2. Right to vote = A delegation of

women from the Women Indian Association

Voiced the empowerment of women.
This met success with the Government of India act 1919 giving representation to women.

3. Reforming personal laws - The AIWC

All India women's congress stressed for reforms in personal laws, against polygamy equal share, etc. This led to enactment of Triple ~~Taluk~~ law and started deliberations on Uniform civil Code.

4. Women empowerment: The Women's Charter of Rights and duties in 1945-46 demanded equality in all sphere. The 73rd and 74th amendment act has give one-third representation to women.

The women's rights has been a long struggle to get equal rightful share in the constitution. The pre-independence feminist movements were the precursor of reforms.
