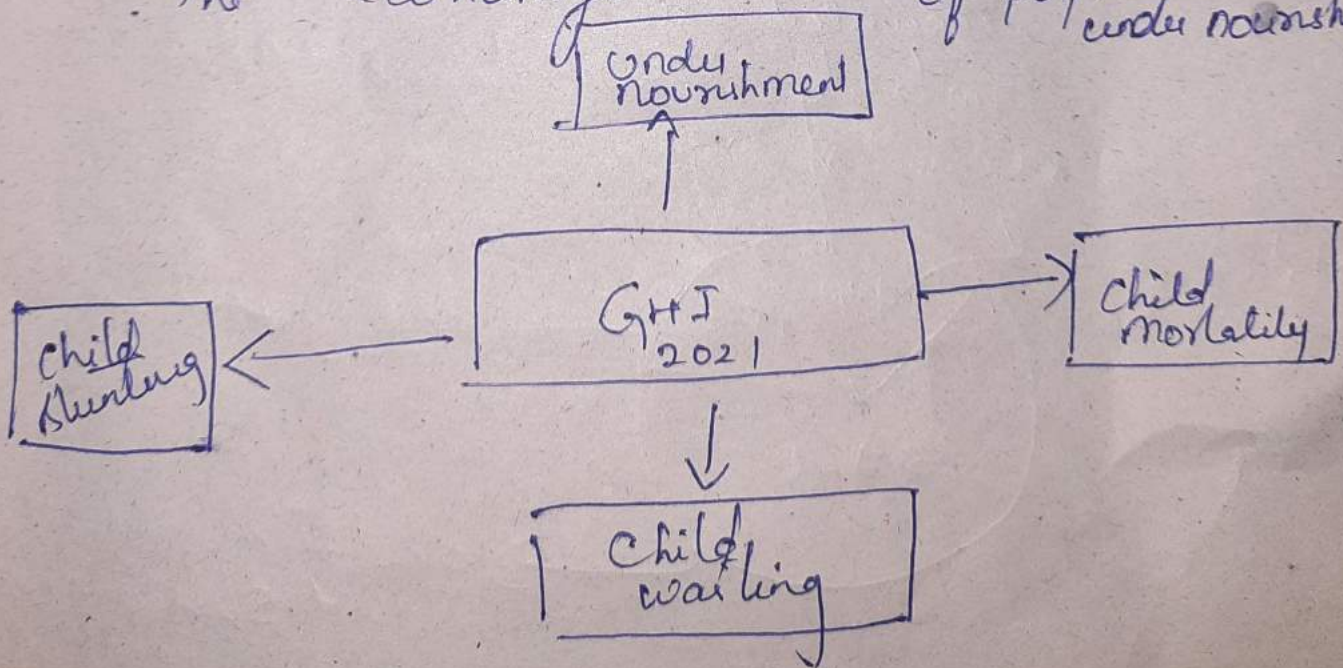


Global Hunger Index is conducted annually using indicators like undernourishment, child wasting, child stunting & child mortality. India ranks 101 among 116 countries.

WHAT GHI Survey INDICATES?

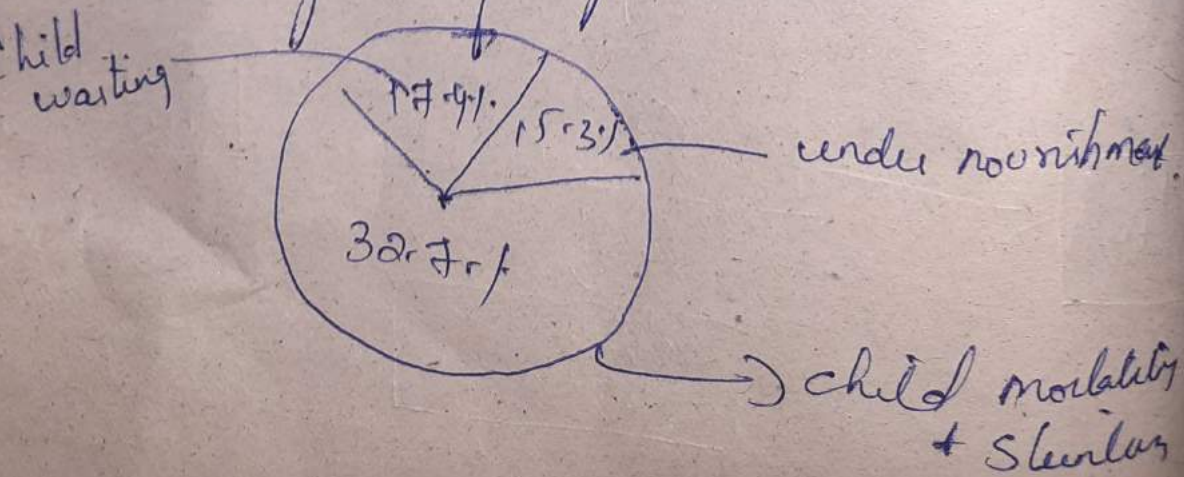
It broadly talks about the hunger & nourishment, growth & death level of children upto age 5.

* India hasn't fared well in the 'under nourishment' indicator i.e. the ~~majority~~ majority of population reflects the intake of under calorie consumption.

* Child wasting :- The ~~percentage~~ reduction of the child due to no proper nutritive food.

* Child stunting :- The height & weight of the child not par to ~~the~~ their age.

* Child mortality :- India has accounted ~~incase~~ increase in child mortality even before completing 5 years of age.
