

In the wake of new decades modes of terrorism international cooperation can be a possible solution to handle them effectively. Explain.

Ans - India's mainly security threats from across the borders based terrorists - centres that create casualties for India from time to time. For this after drum attack India raised voice on international platform to counter this.

Some of the specific points related to this as follows:-

(i) Recently in Jammu on 27-28th June a drone attack on India Air force base creates a new type terrorist attack in front of India and we can say this type of attack first time in India.

(ii) The use of Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAV) autonomous weapons systems and robotics soldiers by states in wayfarer and policing has raised moral and practical questions that remain unresolved.

(iii) New modes of sabotage and vengeance enabled by technology reduce costs and risk of identifications for terrorists

while increasing their efficacy. Security agencies would find conventional tools insufficient in combating terrorism.

(iv) The existing international framework for controlling the proliferation of technology that can be weaponised, such as the Wassenaar Arrangement and Missile Technology Control Regime, is also largely irrelevant in the emerging scenario.

(v) If India is giving a voice in U.N. to take a particular action against this, with the help of U.N. then we can say U.N. are today not more strong than before no terror-responsible countries ready to control or counter their terrorists centres. They are not given value of U.N. laws so that India need to developed anti-terror - defence system to respond this. Now we can say India need to developed advanced security system to counter this type of attack and can make a separate group with their friendly countries.
