- Growing tension between India and China
  - ↳ tension between India and China on Ladakh standoff
  - ↳ China's spread its in Indian Ocean region.
  - ↳ China's Claim in South China Sea (a dash line concept)
- Growing tension between China and USA
  - ↳ trade war has increased
  - ↳ China faces sanction from America
  - ↳ China and USA counter on South China Sea.
- Growing tension between China and its neighbours
  - ↳ China violates the Taiwan Airspace
  - ↳ China exploits the Vietnam fishermen.
