- According to the United Nations, over 20 million people are refugees and India houses almost 8 lakh of them
- India has taken part in almost 49 peacekeeping missions and also accepted refugees of partition and rehabilitation in the past. This poses a need for India to have a sustainable refugee policy.

### Need for a refugee policy in India

- Despite of India having border issues and security threats, India extends its humanitarian assistance to the refugees who try to find ground in the country.
- India has the second largest number of refugees after Bangladesh and has refugees from 1980's Sri Lanka, Zoroastrians from Iran and some from Afghanistan.
- Refugees bridge the labour gap in the market and are largely employed in retail, hospitality, manufacturing and food industries. Hence they contribute to the economic activity.
- India assures the rule of law to the people residing in it. A formulated refugee policy may prove beneficial.

## Benefits of enforcing a refugee policy

- It showcase India's leadership abilities at a global level and improves funding.
- Helps to ensure accountability and transparency in bureaucracy.
- Refugee's enter India for either economic, social, or political, security reasons. Hence assuring a policy for them enhances India's global image.
- Formulating policy based on India & refugee's home land rules can help to reduce tiff or clash with that particular home land.
- Legislating a policy differentiate the role of the government, judiciary and the UN.
