

There is a need for more funding for research in the field as set along with existing bureaucratic procedure.

The budget 2023-24 allocated a healthy ₹16,3000 crores to the Science and Technology ministry a 15% nominal increase compared to the previous budget estimates. In order to improve the footprint of science bureaucratic hurdles needs to be weeded off.

Funding Research

The Global Innovation Index reports India as the largest publisher of scientific literatures, yet the government expenditure on research and development is only 0.7% of the GDP.

The developed nations spend around ≥1% of GDP which creates greater multiplier effects on the economy.

The funding for the BIRAC -
Bioscience and Industrial research
assistance council which implemented
the mission could survive is
cut by 40%. This crumbles the
funds to develop newer ventures.

Easing bureaucratic hurdles

The unprocessed allocation for National
Research Foundation must make available
quality research institutes and
equipments to the researchers.

The funding for research scholars
must be prompt. These measures
can take India to the research
hub and can be horizontally
deployed to the various uses of
the enhanced research.
