India pledged as its INDC in
Paris agreement 2015 to

A) climate intensity by 20 to 35%
from 2005 GDP level. and it has already
reduced its intensity by 21% from 2005
level.

B) India also pledged to achieve
40% of its energy needs by non fossil
fuel, with 175 GW energy by 2022 &
450 GW by 2030.

It has the capacity of 36 GW
energy of non fossil fuel today.

many global reports like IPCC climate

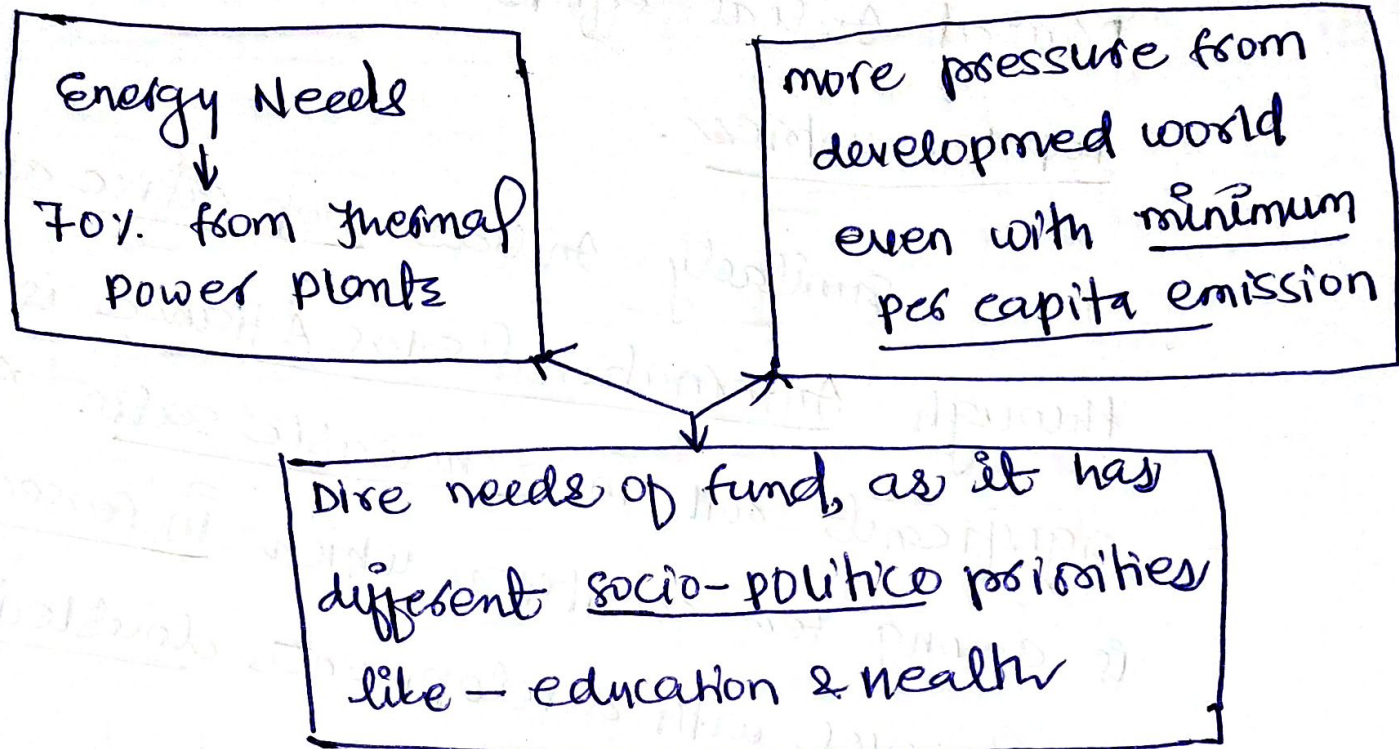
Action plan and climate performance index praised India's efforts and placed it among top 10 countries.
