India is negotiating Free trade agreements (FTA) with UK, EU, Israel, which reduces tariff, have an impact on economic sector of country.

Reason for role of parliament in FTAs

① Executive (com) collectively responsible to legislative which gives an transparency in process of Trade.

(eg) Article 75, council of minister responsible to legislature

② Different committees for scrutiny of trade papers → give clear stand on issue in Trade

→ public standing committee on commerce (PSCC) on trade related

① Inclusiveness - many expert stakeholders concern from parliament benchmark the process of FTA's

② Pressure of opposition party while taking decision on FTA's

↳ help to take correct decision on trade issues

③ By ~~the~~ producing FTA's papers before parliament for certain duration

↳ this debate will give clear view on FTA's impacts

④ It stops the control of executive power on foreign trades.

Hence, parliament has an efficient role in making FTA's ratification which ensures India's \$2 trillion export target by 2030.
