
Do you think that after the Reorganization Act Union territory Jammu & Kashmir has limited Participatory Democracy?

Reorganization Act, 1956 :

According to the Article 3 of Indian Constitution a State either can become a Union Territory (or) can change in its original status.

Union territory of Jammu & Kashmir:

- Bifurcated from erstwhile State of Jammu & Kashmir, also from Bicameralism
- Implementation of Article 370, inclusion of Leh & Kargil Districts.
- 90% of tribal (Gujjars, Bots, Bakarwals etc.)
- Hill Council at Grass root level / 26 Elected representatives
→ 4 Nominated by minority & women folk.
- Union territory without legislature
- Cultural, Ethnic & Linguistic Diversity with more Border disputes.



Way Ahead:

"The Indian Nation will achieve the status mother of all Democracy when all the organs federal Government comes unite and existing vulnerability in administration is improved by means of Amendments, Cooperation within the organs and with constitutional remedy.
