over Indian ocean is CHN's growing presence around Indian ocean especially near [SL] through its BRI initiative.


* CHN dominance in Indian ocean As SL faces heavy debt & distress, it swapped Hambantota port for its part of debt to the various Chinese entities.

* Now, Hambantota port is under control of CHN by this it's military vessel movement in Indian ocean threats India's maritime security.

* Indian ocean accounts for $\frac{1}{5}$ th of world waters, and 80% of maritime oil trade carry via this ocean.

* CHN's interest in Indian ocean in the context of OBOR puts middle & lower economy countries under debt.
