

In a process of electoral reforms, the decision of Election Commission of India to allow postal ballot to migrants in Upcoming elections is a way to realise Universal Adult franchise.

migrants in India constitute 145mn population and 180 mn from them are circular migrants. This makes them non permanent resident - excluded from the electoral machinery, because ECI allows for only IN PERSON VOTING at AT HOME CONSTITUENCY.

This has increased the vulnerability of migrants

(i) Non interest group - incapable of voting, their interest hardly matters to political parties.

(ii) Unaccountable legislative - AS seen during pandemic & migrant exodus parliament hardly debated on the issue.

iii) Multiplying Vulnerabilities - As per
Ajeevika Bureau (study) majority of migrant
constitute - SC/ST/minority / poor, thus
the only power of vote is also taken
from them.

As per various judgement of
SC - Article 19(1)(g) provides for right to
vote, but it is not equivalent to
Accessibility of vote.

section 60CC of RPA 1951, provides
for identification of vulnerable section such
as disabled and aged group to caste
voting through Electoral Ballot. This
also includes 18 lakh security personnel
and more than 3 crore international
migrants from India.

Thus, providing RE-ENFRANCHISE-
MENT is a best way forward to
realise true value of Republic. It
can be done through :-

(i) Electoral postal Ballot - where ballot is sent through mails & received through post. It has duel layer identification system and is in line with Digital India.

(ii) Proxy voting - As done in case of Indian diaspora, it will help migrants to cast vote easily.

(iii) Accessing voting centres at host cities - This will require huge fund and may not be a viable option.

However, challenges like cyber security, malfucntioning of voting, documentation are there. Thus ECI must ensure free & fair election.

Right to vote can only be realised with accessibility of vote to realise one-vote-one nation-one value system.
