Ques) What is the need for registering a political party with the election commission? Discuss the various recognitions accorded by the election commission. (200)

Ans) The election commission is responsible for the conduction of National and state elections and it becomes the body to register the eligible political parties for efficient conduction of elections.

Any individual or organisation willing to form a political party and register the same needs to follow a set of procedure and provide relevant documents to the commission.

Registration of parties is not compulsory but advisable as-

- ① While registering, the formation documents, affidavits of members and oath documents are submitted. It ensures transparency and accountability of the concerned party.
- ② The parties registering must have a proper internal election system which prevents arbitrariness and concentration of power.

- ③ It is required for the registering party to present a rulebook and memorandum to be duly submitted which further enforces them to be disciplined
- ④ Registered political parties get advantage in allotment of free symbols as compared to independent ones.
- ⑤ They can avail the provisions of Representation of People's Act's (registration of parties provisions)
- ⑥ They can further be recognised as state / national parties after fulfilling and maintaining certain criteria. This provides them with further amenities.

Election commission recognises registered parties as

State Party

(on getting  $\frac{1}{4}$ % valid votes from the state election  
the total valid votes polled by all the  
and 2 seats in Legislative Assembly  
or

6% valid votes and in Lok Sabha  
elections at least 1 seat in Lok Sabha  
or

3% or 3 seats in state  
Legislative Assembly  
or

8% of the valid votes in  
the general election of  
Lok Sabha

National Party

If the party gets

~~more than~~  
6% of the valid votes  
from 4 or more states  
in Lok Sabha elections  
and 4 seats in Lok Sabha  
or

2% seats are won by it  
and candidates must be  
elected from 3 or more  
states  
or

If it is recognised as a  
state party in 4 or more  
states.

A recognised political party will get provisions like official workspace in capital city, free utilities, subsidies, an exclusive symbol, funding etc. The management of election can become more efficient by proper registration and recognition of parties and adds up to transparency and accountability.
