

Q. The Sarvagya Shiksha Scheme aims to make learning more equitable and inclusive, joyful and bring organization in the experience of both teachers and learners. Explain.

Ans:- With the broadest goal of improving school effectiveness measured in terms of equal opportunity for schooling and equitable learning outcomes, government launched this scheme.

Important points regarding this scheme as follows:-

- (i) The Union Budget, 2018-19, has proposed to treat school education holistically without segmentation from pre-primary to class 12.
- (ii) Sarvagya Shiksha - an overarching programme for the school education sector extending from pre-school.
- (iii) The scheme covers 116 million schools, over 156 million students and 8.7 million teachers of government.
- (iv) It subsumes the three schemes of Sarva-Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA), Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA), and Teacher Education (TE).

- (v) Master trainers for pre-primary teachers and organized workers will be supported under the scheme.
- (vi) Vision 2.0 of the scheme focuses on access and retention, strengthening foundations, equity and inclusion, quality and standards.
- (vii) It aims to attract 16 to 19 year-old out of school children through the open school system.
- (viii) The NIPUN Bharat Mission for foundational literacy and numeracy is a front-line component under the new Danya-Shiksha.
- (ix) These special disabilities identified under the PWD Act of 2016, many of which are difficult to identify in a classroom setting.
- (x) SEERT, District Institutions for Educational Training Block and cluster resource centers are expected to re-invigorate the teaching community.
