Ban on Single use plastic

Why Ban on Single use plastic?

is mostly of petro chemical material, its non biodegradable. Any plastic below 50 micron is very harmful & cause diseases like cancer. Burning them can also produce environmental effect. So

banning them step by step is the optimum way to save the organisms.

Government Initiatives : Government of India has taken the ban of plastic & single use plastic very serious efforts such as Swachh Bharat, Project REPLAN, India plastic Pact are some of the initiatives. But despite that the use continues.....

Peoples contribution & NGOs :- Awareness with incentives are catching up fast.

- ① In Maharashtra for 1 milk packet used for recycling the citizen get ₹2 per packet.
- ② Segregating plastic waste and use it for recycling or for thermal power with chemical treatment
- ③ Extended producer Responsibilities of the companies can greatly help in reducing single use plastic.

As of July 1 2022 11 single use plastic items will be banned. though govt can only persuade it the responsibility of the citizens to take care of their own nation by being eco active.
