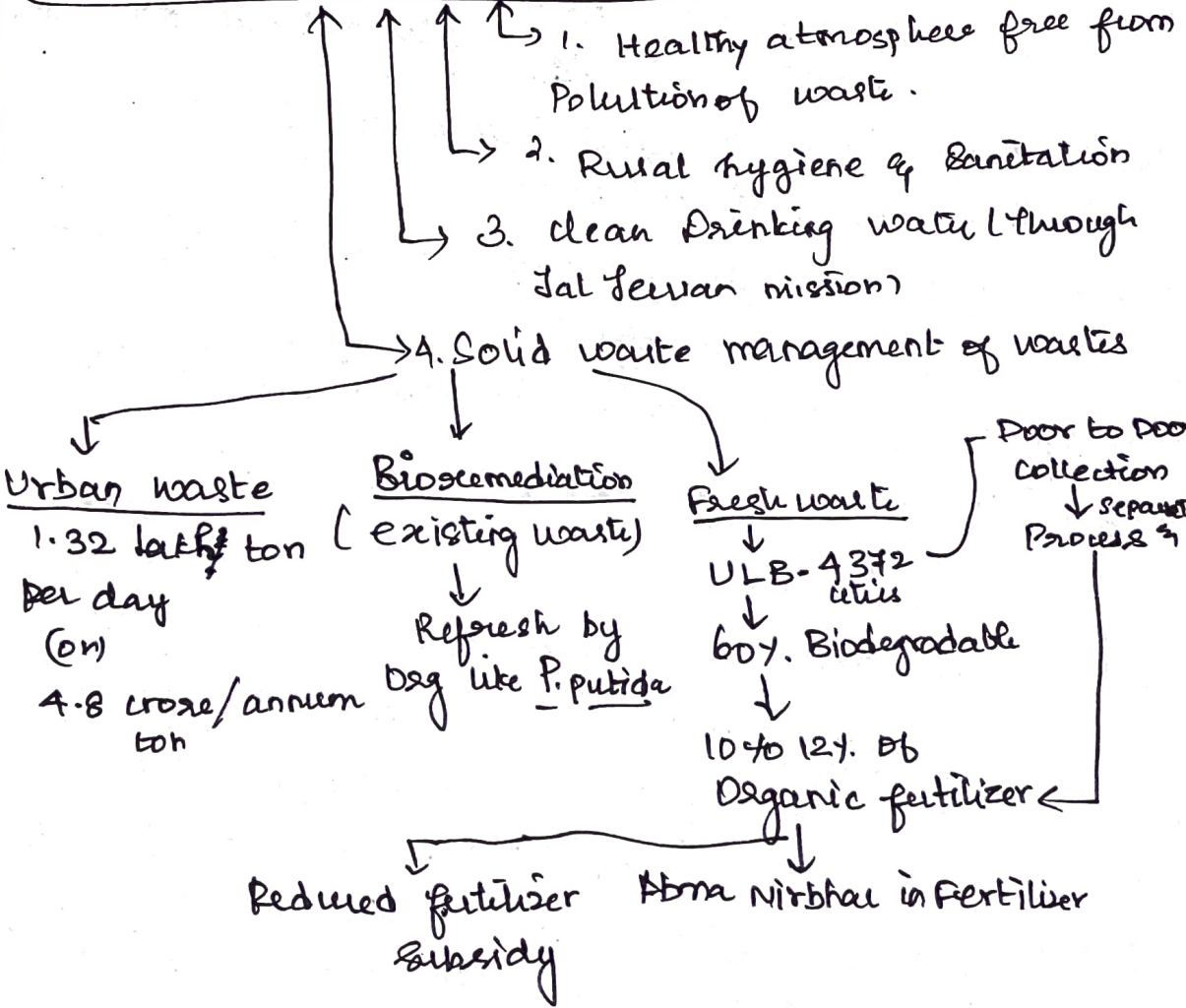


Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) 2.0 Guidelines continue to take forward the aims of the SBM launched in 2014 along with solid waste management. Explain.

Aim of Swachh Bharat Mission 2014 with solid waste management

● To provide citizens with Health & liveable Atmosphere.

→ To curb further spread of disease epidemics
→ Prevent the degradation of land & water resources.

→ Developing Rural Infrastructure & promoting awareness & Education on clean surrounding & Hygiene which was reflecting in "Swachh Survekshan Award" → Cleanliness Index.

→ Embracing funding from mission:

1) State	- 28.01%	} by the 15 th Finance Commission of India.
2) Central	- 35%	
3) ULB	- 42%	

→ 100% to UT without legislative assembly

→ 90% HP, 80% to UT and so on.

→ Facilitating waste disposal mechanism & improving Organic fertilizer production

→ Usage of waste as fuel & increasing community participation.

Though the aim was higher, we need fund to be released, Infrastructure should be made, Public Re-orientation should be removed, Technology has to be developed.
