As per the Data of Department of Food & Public distribution 44.4 MMTE of wheat have been procured and demand for wheat inside the country is also high due to consumption pattern.


Threat Over seas:

Various subsidies and MSP policies; But without which would be pathetic for cultivators.

Why in near future may push to import?

- Though wheat stands as high consuming cereal crop, the production was only confined in Rabi season.
- Poor quality of soil, fertilizer and Pesticidal pollution poses threat to the food security and causes disease like Blue Baby Syndrome in Punjab.
- High cost machines and technologies such as "Happy Seeder" are far away to small & marginal farmers who contribute 85% of domain.
- Reduced Budget allocation for Agriculture (2022-23) and priority for change over millets also pose threat in adoption and sustainable production.
- Change in bilateral regimes in International trade may lead to compromise the food safety and inflation inside India.



Way forward:

- * Crop and farm resilient practices such as PUSA decomposers and reduced carbon footprint Technologies must be adopted.
- * Extensionist in Agriculture must act in farm in accordance with global scenario
- * Govt intervention in policy making and implementation must be neutral considering farm as well as home
